1. The meeting was called to order with proper social distancing among everyone and with accommodation for the public through the use of Zoom Meetings at 9:00 A.M. Board President Denny Clemens called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

3. Consent Items

Mr. McKinney made a motion to approve Consent Items 3.1 and 3.2. Mr. Neal seconded; motion passed 4-0 (AYES: Barr, Clemens, Neal, McKinney; ABSENT: Dashner).

4. COMMITTEE REPORTS

4.1. Finance Committee (Directors Dashner & Barr)

Chief Johnson noted the District was approaching the half-year mark with the Financial Summary from the Calaveras County Auditor's Office showing \$900,000. He reviewed the projected carryover at the end of the fiscal year with various reimbursements from grants and fires.

4.2. Personnel/Safety Committee (Directors Dashner & McKinney)

Chief Johnson reported there had been no injuries yet there had been staffing challenges. He also noted that the information would soon be input into the GovInvest for projection usage.

4.3. Fire Prevention Committee (Directors Clemens & Neal)

Chief Johnson reported that some building plans had been sent and determined the property should be sprinklered and the new Cruzers had received its final fire inspection.

4.4. Apparatus/Equipment Committee (Directors McKinney & Neal)

Chief Johnson reported briefly on the E435 repowering and on the installations of lights and radios in the newest UTV Ranger-Crew. He also reported that the new BC vehicle had been ordered and could arrive in February. Additionally, one ambulance was at Thompson's for warranty repair.

5. Scheduled Items

5.1. <u>Industrial Disability Retirement: Consideration of Granting and Employee Industrial Disability Retirement – Closed Session, Government Code Section 54957</u>
The Board members went into closed session to review and discuss the attorney findings.

Upon return to Open Session, Mr. MicKinney made a motion to approve Resolution 2021-8: Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Ebbetts Pass Fire District Determining that Firefighter-Paramedic Dana K. Johnson is Entitled to an Industrial Disability Retirement. Mr. Barr seconded; motion passed 4-0 (AYES: Barr, Clemens, Neal, McKinney; ABSENT: Dashner).

5.2. Calaveras Fire Joint Powers Authority: Consideration of Participating in a Countywide Fire Agency Purchase of a Mobile Air Trailer to Fill Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus Bottles

Chief Johnson explained the procedures for the use of the proposed unit and the grant application process and estimated the cost to be approximately \$17,000. Following some discussion, Mr. Neal made a motion to approve the District's participation in a countywide fire agency purchase of a mobile air trailer to fill SCBA bottles. Mr. Barr seconded; motion passed 4-0 (AYES: Barr, Clemens, Neal, McKinney; ABSENT: Dashner).

5.3. Dept. of Health Care Services: GEMT Overpayment for Years 2011 and 2014
Chief Johnson reported on the invoice received from the DHCS for refunding the overpayment for years 2011 and 2014. He commented that the Board would be having to considering increasing the budget line item for refunds before the end of the fiscal year.

Whereas self-contained breathing apparatus are an essential tool for firefighters, and Whereas prompt refilling of air bottles is necessary so that those bottles can continue being used during extended incidents and so that engines can be restocked to prepare them for future calls, and

Whereas the mobile breathing support unit that serves the county is 37 years old and at the end of its service life,

Therefore the fire districts of Calaveras County enter into this Memorandum of Understanding to cooperate in the purchase of a trailer-based breathing support unit that meets all current standards.

The fire districts further agree that they will share the approximate \$161,000 cost

- Evenly divided nine ways, or approximately \$17,811 each.

The districts understand that the final price could be somewhat less than this estimate or up to 5 percent higher depending on price increases and delivery method. The other districts shall forward their share of the cost to San Andreas Fire Protection District upon presentation of an invoice detailing the purchase cost.

The districts further agree that San Andreas Fire Protection District will house and staff the breathing support unit and supply a truck to tow it to incidents. The districts further agree that San Andreas Fire personnel shall train personnel from the other districts to operate the breathing support unit and shall make it available during trainings and other planned events in addition to its deployment during emergencies.

EMPLOYMENT PRACTICE LIABILITY - NEW PROTOCOLS

Employment Practice Liability (EPL) related losses, commonly known as discrimination, sexual harassment, demotion, failure to promote, wrongful termination (etc.), have cost FAIRA \$6+ million over the past ten years and is the single greatest liability risk for employers and FAIRA as a pool. Managing our EPL losses is one of the best ways we have to control the future cost of our insurance.

There is proof that when EPL actions occur and the proper professionals are engaged early in the process, that the legal costs are significantly less and litigation can often be avoided. With this in mind, the FAIRA Board of Directors' adopted protocols at the September 13, 2021 Board of Directors' that require that all members engage outside employment law counsel prior to taking personnel actions. Please note that the placing of an employee or volunteer on administrative leave does <u>not</u> require prior consultation.

We understand that many Districts have relationships with will EPL attorneys that they wish to maintain; please continue to do so. For those who do not have relationships with EPL attorneys, FAIRA will make the services of Peter Flandera available for up to 3 hours of consultation prior to taking personnel actions.

If an Employment incident results in an EPLI claim, it will be necessary that you provide proof of previous consultation when submitting your claim to the carrier, or you will be subject to a \$25,000 minimum EPL Deductible. (We have attached a partial list of the common EPL actions seen by today's employers.) If you are not sure if you have an EPL occurrence feel free to reach out to us. In many cases we will recommend that you report any incident that you feel may give rise to a claim to the carrier at: fairaclaimsreporting@networkadjusters.com. The earlier the claim's professionals become involved, the better the chances are of managing the process, and there is no penalty for filing an "incident" that does not turn into a claim.

The good news is that there are not a lot of EPL claims. They are low frequency but high severity. Unfortunately for those of you who have had that one or two EPL claims in your career, you know that these are large dollar claims that can become all-consuming and stressful. This past year we had a Chief who was faced with not just one, but two EPL claims. He engaged counsel early on and ultimately both cases were dropped. This is proof that early engagement of EPL counsel works!

These new protocols go into effect on January 1, 2022.

Example Employment Actions Requiring Legal Attention

- Any complaint by an employee that he/she has been discriminated against or otherwise treated unfairly because he/she has suffered a workplace injury or otherwise participated in the California workers' compensation system.
- Any complaint by an employee or volunteer that he/she has been sexually harassed or otherwise has been the victim of a hostile work environment based on any protected category, including, without limitation, race, national origin, gender, age, religion, disability, medical condition, pregnancy, sexual orientation, marital status and veteran / military status.
- Any complaint by an employee or volunteer that he/she has been retaliated
 against based on his/her engagement in any protected activity, including,
 without limitation, complaining about alleged discrimination, harassment,
 wage disparity, unsafe workplace conditions or illegal fire district activity
 (whistleblowing).
- Any complaint by an employee or volunteer that he/she has been bullied in the workplace based on any protected category, including, without limitation, race, national origin, gender, age, religion, disability, medical condition, pregnancy, sexual orientation, marital status and veteran / military status.
- Any decision to conduct an internal investigation into complaints of workplace misconduct, including, without limitation, discrimination, harassment, retaliation, bullying, workplace safety.
- Any complaint by an employee or volunteer that the fire district failed to prevent discrimination, harassment, retaliation or bullying or failed to investigate allegations of discrimination, harassment, retaliation or bullying.
- Any complaint by an employee or volunteer that he/she has been denied statutorily mandated meal periods, rest breaks or rec very breaks.
- Any complaint by an employee that he/she has not received all wages and/or benefits and/or expense reimbursements due and owing that employee.
- Any decision for whatever reason not to pay an employee all wages due and owing that employee at the time of termination or resignation.
- Any complaint by an employee or volunteer regarding workplace safety or that an unsafe workplace environment exists (OSHA / Cal-OSHA).



- Any decision to terminate an employee or take other adverse employment action (e.g., suspension, demotion, shift change, compensation reduction) when that employee falls into one or more protected categories or has engaged in some protected activity.
- Any investigation of an employee that includes an interrogation of that employee orotherwise triggers employee rights under the FBOR.
- Any request that an employee or volunteer submit to a physical or mental medical examination (excluding clearance for Workers' Compensation injuries.)
- Any request that an employee or volunteer submit to a drug test other than a drug test based on reasonable suspicion.
- Any request by an employee that he/she be provided time off to enter alcohol or drug rehabilitation.
- Any request that an employee or volunteer submit to a polygraph test, lie detector test or psychological testing.
- Any decision to deny an employee's or volunteer's request for reasonable accommodation due to a disability.
- Any decision to refuse to engage an employee or volunteer in an interactive process to determine whether a reasonable accommodation is possible for that employee or volunteer.
- Any decision to deny an employee federal Family and Medical Leave Act leave, California Family Rights Act leave, California Pregnancy Disability Leave Act leave, or any other statutorily mandated leave of absence.
- Any decision not to return an employee to his or her job following completion
 of family and medical leave, pregnancy disability leave or any other
 statutorily mandated leave of absence.
- Any anticipated adverse employment action against an employee or volunteer based on conduct of that employee or volunteer occurring during non-work hours.
- Receipt of a demand letter or other correspondence from an attorney on behalf of a current or former employee or volunteer.

Re: Commendation of County personnel for rescue on December 30, 2021

Honorable Board Members:

Four of us were in a cabin in Arnold celebrating the Christmas holiday when the power went off on Sunday, the 26th, at 7:30am. We had plenty of firewood and a fair amount of food, and as owners of two recreational properties in Arnold for more than twenty years, we had faith that this too would pass. But it didn't, and the four of us, who are in our seventies and somewhat vulnerable, started to feel trapped.

It kept snowing, burying our cars and the driveway in a blanket of snow three feet thick. With no power, no heat other than the fireplace, diminishing food, and no way to get out by car, the situation got worse and worse. We had contracted with a local snow removal company to have the driveway plowed Tuesday morning, but nobody had showed up by Thursday, and the company phone mailbox no longer took messages.

By Thursday afternoon, after four full days of these conditions, we started to dig a walkway through the snow to evaluate the condition of the road at the end of the driveway, which was about two hundred feet away and out of sight from the cabin. When we finally got to a place where the road came into view, we saw that a tree had fallen and had knocked a power line across the driveway. It was time for outside help.

A call to 911 was routed to CalFire and within twenty minutes a fireman named Sean showed up at the bottom of the driveway and assessed the situation. After half an hour of trying to find alternative escape routes, he was joined by his superior, Battalion Chief Aaron, and they determined that the wire was safe to cross over.

Sean dug from the bottom, and we dug from the top until our shovels met, creating a clear path from the cabin to the road. We packed up our essentials, walked down to their rescue vehicles, and they drove us to a warming center at Independence Hall.

The welcome we received at the hall by the County personnel was so wonderful that some of us were reduced to tears: the ordeal was finally over, we were warm, and we were safe. We were given hot coffee, water, hot ham and cheese sandwiches, snacks, a packet with a mini blanket, and most of all, hope. We could charge our phones for the first time in days, make contact with family and friends, and start planning an exit strategy.

When I asked what these people did when they were not guardian angels, they replied that they worked for the County. We did not get last names, so our gratitude can only be expressed with hopes that you can identify the individuals involved. I have already mentioned the fire personnel. Sean was at all times efficient, conscientious about our health and safety, and comforting. He embodies all the qualities that a first responder should aim to achieve. Chief Aaron followed through and got us where we had to be.

At the hall, there were three women in civilian clothes and a man in uniform. The women, I believe, were named Robin, Stacey and Christa. The uniformed man was John. Each one of them made us feel welcome in a way that meant even more to us than the food and drinks and power outlets. It's difficult to describe the emotions of going from survival mode to being saved. We hadn't been on the high seas in a lifeboat or down a deep cave for days, but the feeling of being rescued certainly overwhelmed us. Because of their efforts, we wish to commend them to you and humbly ask that they be recognized in some fashion for their service to us.

Eventually, we found a phone number for some friends who agreed to take us in for the night. John drove us to their home, where we spent our first warm night since Christmas. On the way to the friends' home, we chatted with John and he revealed that Christa was the County Administrative Officer, and that he was the Director of the Office of Emergency Services. We later learned from our friend

that the fireman who we knew as Sean was Sean Bittner. We had lucked into being helped by the cream of the crop.

Before we knew their positions, these public servants had already impressed us when they said that they loved helping others as part of their jobs. The notion of a public servant often gets demeaned or minimized in today's hyper critical environment, but the men and women who rescued us from that miserable situation truly represent the finest ideal of government in action.

We thank them from the bottom of our hearts and ask that you thank them as well.
